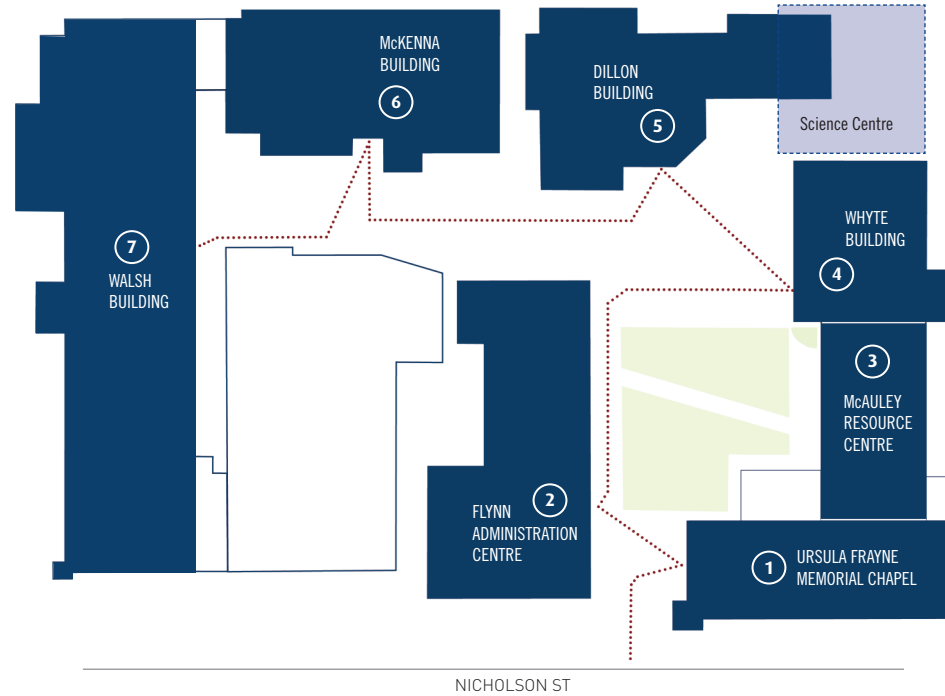

URSULA FRAYNE MEMORIAL CHAPEL

Mother Ursula Frayne rsm
1816-1885. Foundress of the Sisters of Mercy in Australia and of the Academy of Mary Immaculate. A woman of faith and courage.

WALSH BUILDING

Sr Perpetua Walsh rsm
1890-1972. Principal of the Academy and a gifted teacher, Sr Perpetua was a passionate advocate of higher learning for young women.

Catherine Mary Flynn 1841-1914.
Catherine was the first student enrolled at the Academy. She was one of six girls in the inaugural year of 1857.

Mother Catherine McAuley rsm
1778-1841. Foundress of the Sisters of Mercy, Dublin 1831.

Mother Sebastian Whyte rsm

Mother Anne Xavier Dillon rsm
1818-1890. Companion to Mother Ursula Frayne.
